I close my eyes a moment And I live it all again; The past that once was present And that seemed would never end.


I ease while thinking of the times
















Senior Timeline


The volleyball team made it to regional semi-finals. The girls' cross country team also made it to regionals.


We listened to top artists like 3OH!3, Lady Gaga, Kayne West, Lil Wayne and Katy Perry.












In conclusion, Mrs. Dye chose to share a favorite quote from poet Langston Hughes that she feels is a great philosophy to live by:
